The Turkish Coalition of America is pleased to sponsor up to 100 “Study Abroad in Turkey” Scholarships per year for American minority students. These scholarships are awarded to eligible undergraduate and graduate level students who have been accepted to a university in Turkey or in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC).

Scholarships range from \$500 to \$2,000 and are intended to contribute towards the cost of studying abroad.

Like its neighbor to the North, the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) offers astonishingly beautiful sites and a rich cultural history. Praised for its picturesque settings and low cost of living, TRNC offers a wealth of experience in an intimate atmosphere. Nevertheless, the island is at the center of exciting political developments as negotiations between the Greek and Turkish Cypriots continue under UN mandate. English is widely spoken on the TRNC providing for ease of communication.

- Enrolled full-time, in good standing at an accredited U.S. college or university
- Accepted into a Study Abroad program at a university in Turkey or Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC)
- Willing to share about experiences in Turkey with the TCA community and Diversity Abroad

What is the Scholarship Amount?

For study in Turkey or the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC), scholarships range from \$500 to \$2,000 and are as follows:

- \$2,000 for a semester or year
- \$1,000 for studying the Turkish language
- \$1,000 for summer programs lasting for more than 4 weeks
- \$ 500 for summer programs lasting up to 4 weeks sponsored by U.S. educational institutions or Turkish/TRNC universities
- \$500 for participants in university/college-sponsored study tours to Turkey or the TRNC.

How do I apply?

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.

Applications must include:

- Completed Application form (available online)
- Your photo
- Documentation verifying that you will be participating in a study abroad program at a university in Turkey or the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus
- Your resume on a single 8.5 x 11' sheet of paper
- Official transcript (please send the original, NOT a copy. Transcript must be included with your application, NOT sent separately.)

Scholarship recipients are selected by Diversity Abroad and will receive a check from the Turkish Coalition of America prior to departure to Turkey for study abroad.
